**SIGNIFICANCE**

19. Briefly state historical and/or architectural importance (include dates, events, and persons associated with the site.)  
The Long Family Cemetary is a memorial to the pioneer Long family. William Long, a native of Ohio; his wife Sarah (Beach) (1827-1893), came across the plains in 1853 and settled in this section of the survey area between Litton Springs and Geyserville. William set about developing the farm which his son Isaac inherited. Gold mining on Yuba River attracted Isaac for a short time, but he soon returned to the ranch. His wife, Sarah F., (1832-1887) had three children: John S., a successful agriculturist; George W.; and Alice, wife of John H. Stone of Sonoma County. The earliest burial in the cementary was Elmo Long, an infant, buried in 1883.
