- 7b. Briefly describe the present *physical description* of the site or structure and describe any major alterations from its original condition:

The main hip-roof of this one-story house has a gablet and a gabled side dormer. There are gabled bays in the front and on the side. Front and side porches have hip roofs. The house has a boxed cornice with small brackets. The bay gables have segmented windows with colored glass and cut shingles. The gablet has a pointed vent and it and the dormer gable also have cut shingles. The slanted front bay has molded panels beneath the windows and corner braces with pendants. The side bay is square and has a bracketed awning. The windows are tall, narrow, double-hungs. The front porch has turned posts, and sawn chamfered posts and sawn brackets. The siding is channel rustic with vertical boards covering the foundation.

**SIGNIFICANCE**

The Young family, continuous Alexander Valley residents since 1868, have been an integral part of the development of that section of the Sotoyome Rancho. Michael Young, born in Germany in 1822, immigrated to California via New York in 1852. Young, an Alexander Valley rancher since 1868, contracted Knight Hagman to build this home in 1890. It has been occupied by Young family descendants since that time, his great-great nephew James Young the present occupant. Michael Young died in 1898.
