This building is a good example of an attempt to "modernize" a house to style trends of a later but still victorian period. This home, built in 1888, has had numerous owners over the years. A title research traces it back to William T. and Maud Heald. William T. was the son of Jacob G. Heald, the brother of Harmon Heald, the acknowledged founder of the town that bears the family name. In 1856, Harmon & Jacob bought large tracts of land from the Fitch family, original holders of the Spanish land grant called the Sotoyome Rancho. The Heald's owned vast amounts of property, ban mills, hotels, wineries, and various other enterprises in the fledglitown.	iks,
