This 1½ story house is rectangular in shape with a centered open gable in the rear. In front, the roof is low and flared to cover the recessed porch. The cornice is closed. The windows vary. Some are plate glass and some are double-hung or sliding aluminum. The siding is wide lap style with very narrow corner boards and may not be original. The front porch has Tuscan columns and very delicately spindled balustrade.
