

This two-story multi-gabled bungalow on the corner of Fitch and Plaza is a large example of the 1920's bungalows that appear on Plaza Street and throughout Healdsburg.

The many gables are low and wide with exposed rafters and knee-brace brackets. Windows are single or grouped in three with a wide fixed central pane and narrow double-hung pane flanking. The entrance porch has heavy square stucco posts topped with short tapered wood pillars.

This is a particularly good example of Craftsman style with unusual effort put into having the structural elements such as the roof truss for the front porch be exposed and therefore form the decorative element as well.

This home was built by Lorin and Mamie Foreman as a retirement home in 1920. The Foreman's were successful prune ranchers in the Western survey area (Foreman Lane near Westside Road), and this home is typical of a prestigious home-style of that period.
