7b. Briefly describe the present *physical description* of the site or structure and describe any major alterations from its original condition:

The Olivetto Winery building dating from ca 1880 and set far back off Healdsburg Avenue, is a large square two-story brick structure with a high steep hip-roof. At the peak of the roof is a rectangular cupola with windows. The windows and door openings in the brick building are arched with radiating bricks surrounds. Built of double wall construction with hollow space between the top floor was the formenting room and, by gravity, the wine flowed to storage in the cellar beneath.

3101	Briefly state historical and/or architectural importance (include dates, events, and persons associated with the site.)
	This massive double brick wall winery building was built by local brickmasons, James Briggs and William Burgett and sons, using locally manufactured bricks. It was originally owned by the Franceschini and Demetrio Lorenzini families. Originally known as the Olivetto Winery, it has a storage capacity of 300, gallons. The top floor served as the fermenting room, the wine flowing by gravity to the storage cellar below. The building also contained a brandy distillery. Olivetto wines were shipped to New York. Later the winery was sold to OlJ. LeBaron, and during the prohibition period it produced sacramental wines. In 1930 it was purchased by Rachele Passalacqua, widow of Frank Passalacqua, and at her death it was acquired by her children. The winery was operated by the Passalacqua family under the nam "Sonoma Cellars", and was later leased to eastern wine producer It is currently leased by the E. & J. Gallo Company.
