SIGNIFICANCE 19. Briefly state historical and/or architectural importance (include dates, events, and persons associated with the site.) The production of hops and grapes enjoyed equal popularity in the 188 and by 1906, one-half of all the hops grown in the state were produced in Sonoma County. The Goodman Ranch is a reminder of that time. All Goodman, in 1891, purchased 113 acres of the McPherson ranch and plant 15 acres in hops. By 1900, Frank Goodman is owning a portion of the ranch, and continued in ownership through at least 1934. Sometime do his ownership, the hop kiln was converted into his home. History does not reveal family connection between the two Goodmans: Allen, born 18 in Missouri, married in 1863 Margaret, born 1838 in Missouri, no characteristic form in California in 1872, married Elvira Seamon, born in Gentin 1894. One son Harald was born in 1895. The significance of this plants derived from its history.
