SIGNIFICANCE

19. Briefly state historical and/or architectural importance (include dates, events, and persons associated with the site.) This is the only substantial victorian commercial building with any architectural integrity left on the square. Some amount of the original iron front facade on the ground level still exists. Built in 1900, this building was hailed as the most modern in town. Designed by A. J. Barnett of San Francisco, it was built by W. H. Chaney under the direction of Fred A. Kruse. It was first occupied downstairs by Wells, Fargo & Co., Western Union and Vitousek & Co. Shoe Store. Upstairs the dental office of Dr. J.M. McClish, Dr. H. G. Hewitt and a photograph gallery, there were also housekeeping rooms upstairs. Over the years, the building has been in constant use. Today the downstairs shops are still used for commercial purposes, while the upstairs has been restored and remodeled for use as a bed and breakfast inn.
