This 1½ story structure has evolved in three phases to its present style. It was originally a gabled homestead style without either the front bay or present front porch. The gabled front bay was added probably in the 90's. The porch, with its turned columns with plaster ionic capitals and plaster garlands, was apparently added at a still later date.

## SIGNIFICANCE

19. Briefly state historical and/or architectural importance (include dates, events, and persons associated with the site.)

This house is a good example of period remodeling to update the styling of the house without adding any significant amount of living space. This house has had extensive period remodeling to "update" the house, and it appears that the cornice brackets, ornamental gable, and decorative front door casing, were a later addition in an effort to upgrade the property to a level with the more substantial houses on the block. The main portion of this structure was build in 1872 by Henry W. Brown. Brown, born in Wyoming in 1826, came to California in 1853 and engaged in a series of business enterprises in Grass Valley and Truckee before coming to Healdsburg in 1870 with his family. Here he conducted a business until his death in 1890.
