This building is a two story structure with Italianate features. The roof cornice is detailed with pairs of modillions spaced far apart. The windows are singled, double hung type with small bracketted hoods. The roof is truncated similar to the Italianate style, though the wrap around porch has been added and reflects the 1890's Queen Anne era. There appears to be other additions to the side and rear which were done in keeping with the spirit of the building. The exterior materials and horizontal wood siding.

SIGNIFICANCE 19. Briefly state historical and/or architectural importance (include dates, events, and persons associated with the site.)
Sam Meyer, successful and colorful pioneer merchant, was born in West Prussi in 1843. He came to Healdsburg via New York, and began business at age 17. For 47 years he conducted commercial enterprises which grew from being the second store in Healdsburg's history. The first was operated by Heald. He owned many downtown properties and bought his son Harry's Popular Furniture Store in 1896 when Harry departed to South America. His first marriage was to Dora Abraham in Santa Rosa, 1868. In 1879, he acquired the Downing property on the eastside of the Plaza and the Masnic block on the west, controlling half of the Plaza frontage. He died in San Francisco in 1925, where he had lived for 19 years with his second wife, Mrs. F. Goldstein. Both the Sam Meyer residence and businesses contributed greatly to the communitys' heritage.
This home, which narrowly escaped destruction by fire in both 1893 ane 1902, was Meyer's second local residence, his first being at 308 Tucker St.
