

John addini, an Italian winemaker, purchased 160 acres of the Lytton Springs anch to erect his winery with sufficient land to grow his vines in 902. Seven years later, in 1909 a fire destroyed the winery and contents; oss valued at \$60,000. Gaddini died soon after in San Francisco.
