

This rectilinear stucco structure has a low pitched hip roof with boxed cornice. There is a stuccoed exterior chimney on the west side. Large square stucco pillars support the enclosed front porch and porte cochere, which have flat roofs projecting out from under the main eaves. The grouping of three windows in the front facade are cased in ½ round pilasters and decorative head casing.

19. Briefly state historical and/or architectural importance (include dates, events, and persons associated with the site.) This is an extremely nice example of prairie style architecture with the classical motif of the front window suggesting the possibility that this was an architect designed structure.

This home was built in 1924 for Fred and Hazel Young. Fred Young, born in 1889, was the grandson of pioneer cabinet-maker and coffin-maker, John Young, who established his business in Healdsburg in 1859. Fred Young ran the business (which evolved into a mortuary and undertaking parlor) and conducted it until his death. The mortuary is still run under the same name.
