This one-story structure has open end gables with returns and is topped by a gabled cupola with vented sides. The cornice is boxed, the siding is rustic. A small centered window has sliding doors on each side. The gable end has a centered double-hung window.

SIGNIFICANCE

19. Briefly state historical and/or architectural importance (include dates, events, and persons associated with the site.) Reflecting the challenge of the Russian River Valley to become the greatest grape growing section of California, William Mulligan had, by the year 1885, cultivated the largest vineyard in the Valley with 379 acres in grapes, in nine wine varieties. This was reported in the <u>San Francisco Merchant</u> magazine, 1885, which brought statewide and national publicity to the Alexander Valley resources. By 1888, he was undisputely the owner of the largest vineyard in Sonoma County. However, the next year the Bank of Healdsburg foreclosed on the Mulligan Winery and Vineyard for a \$65,000 note. The one-story single gable barn with cupola stands as a lone reminder of a pioneer of the wine industry.

This barn exhibits details, such as cupola and boxed cornice, seldom seen in outbuildings of a later era.
