These two brick, one-story buildings, built in 1920, in the Renaissance Revival style have a flat roof, plain parapet and molded entablature. Dentils mark the frieze and a decorative band of bricks form a belt course above the first story. The windows are slightly recessed and have lintels of upright bonded brick.
