This large single gable industrial building was constructed in 1913 of corrugated metal. A ventilator with swing windows appears at the center of the roof-line. At the rear is a two-story twinsingle gabled concrete block structure used as an apple dryer when the front building was occupied by Miller Packing Company.

SIGNIFICANCE

19. Briefly state historical and/or architectural importance (include dates, events, and persons associated with the site.)

Prunes have always been an integral part of Healdsburg's agricultural base, becoming the predominent cash crop between 1925 and 1970.Second to dry prunes commercially, John F. Miller and many other partners started a packing plant near the present Railroad Depot between Fitch and Hudson Streets circa 1906; the prune drying yards were on Matheson and First Streets, and at this site were sulphur houses and small drying yards. In 1913 Miller, the partner to Hotchkiss, built this packing house.

Miller Packing Co. packed apples, dried prunes, and pears. During WWII, the plant dehydrated potatoes, carrots, apples, and prunes for the soldiers, producing basically all of the vegetables used in the war.

The building is now occupied by Robert Weiss ceramics.
