_	IGNIFICANCE 9. Briefly state historical and/or architectural importance (include dates, events, and persons associated with the site.) Martin Van Buren Hooten is one of the best-remembered of Healdsburg pioneers due to his local political activities and the breadth of his landownings. Born in 1838 in Missouri, Hooten came to California with his parents in 1852, after a harrowing overland journey that left few survivors due to a cholera outbreak. After mining a short while the family settled for seven years in Petaluma. In 1860 the Hootens came to Healdsburg purchasing what later became the landmark Paxton Ranch, till Martin Hooten sold it in 1879. This homestead was established in 1879, and although Hooten bought and sold much acreage, this remained his home and center for his fruit-drying operations until his death in 1915. The ranch name is derived from his black walnut groves that became a local landmark, and although the ranch was split by the construction of Highway 101 in 1964, some of the trees remain.
