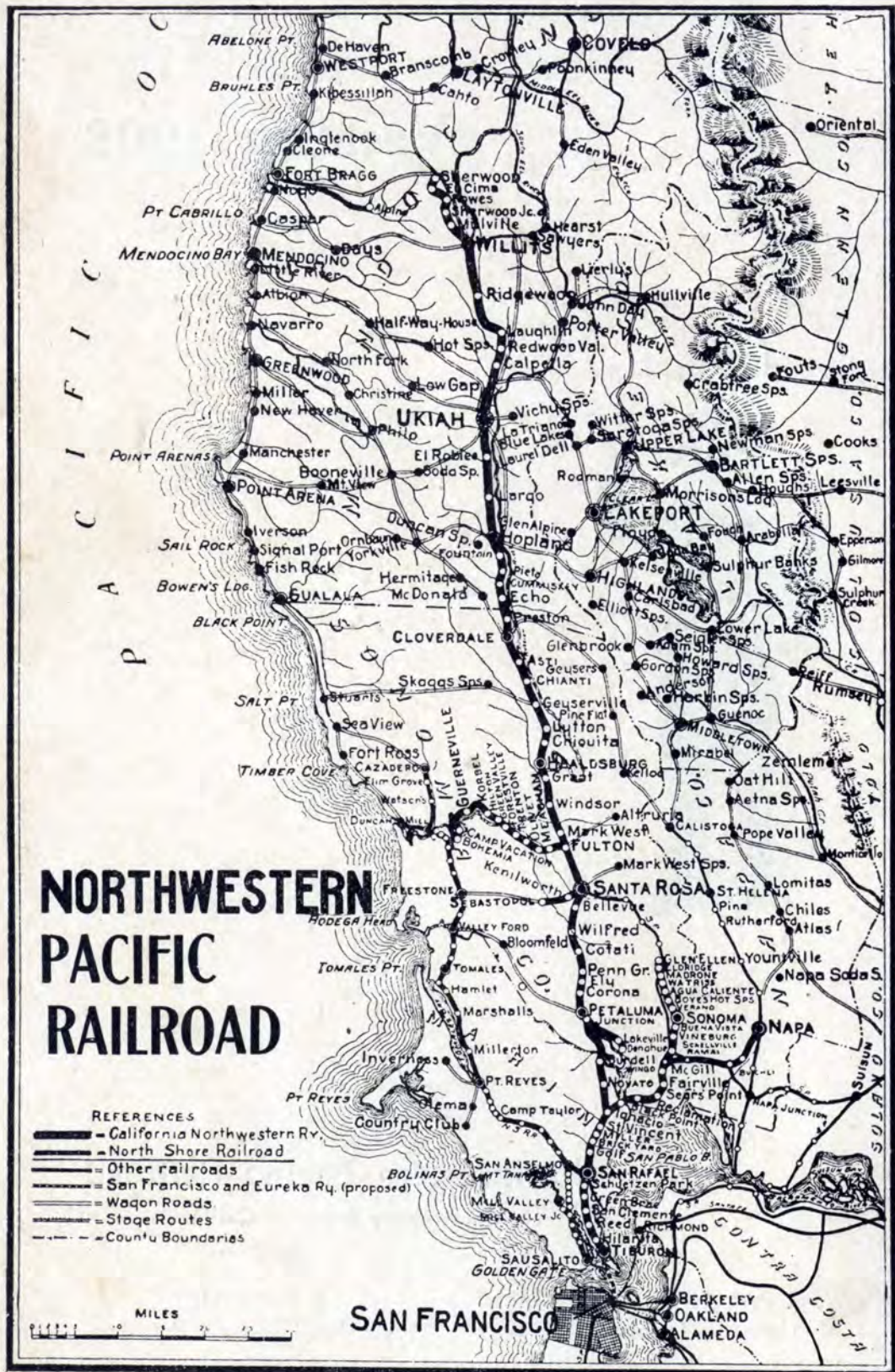

Introduction.



THE NORTHWESTERN PACIFIC RAILROAD, "The Picturesque Route of California," furnishes transportation facilities for Marin, Sonoma, Mendocino, and Lake counties, which lie north of San Francisco. The road traverses Marin, Santa Rosa, Russian River, Ukiah, Sonoma, Redwood, Walker and Willits valleys.

A mountain range on the west, heavily timbered, protects this section from the fogs and winds of the Pacific Ocean, and a similar range on the east forms the dividing line of protection from the heat of the interior.

The rich and varied soils of the valleys and foothills, the excellent pasturage on the ranges, all well wooded; the numerous streams, rivers, and lakes; the abundant rainfall every year, and the climate, semi-tropical and invigorating,—make these counties an ideal farming country, as well as a most desirable haven of rest and recreation for the denizen of the city. Mineral springs of all kinds abound throughout, and the natural spring of pure water is seen everywhere. The streams and lakes are annually stocked with trout from the company's hatchery at Ukiah. Game of all kinds, from quail to deer, is within easy reach. The people are well-to-do and refined. That others may share with them the pleasures of this favored part of California, many have consented to open their homes for the reception of boarders during the summer season.

This book furnishes information so that you can arrange to stop at a hotel or private home in some town, at a mineral-spring resort, rusticate on some farm, or enjoy that camp life so dear to the Californian.



MOONLIGHT ON RUSSIAN RIVER—HEALDSBURG.

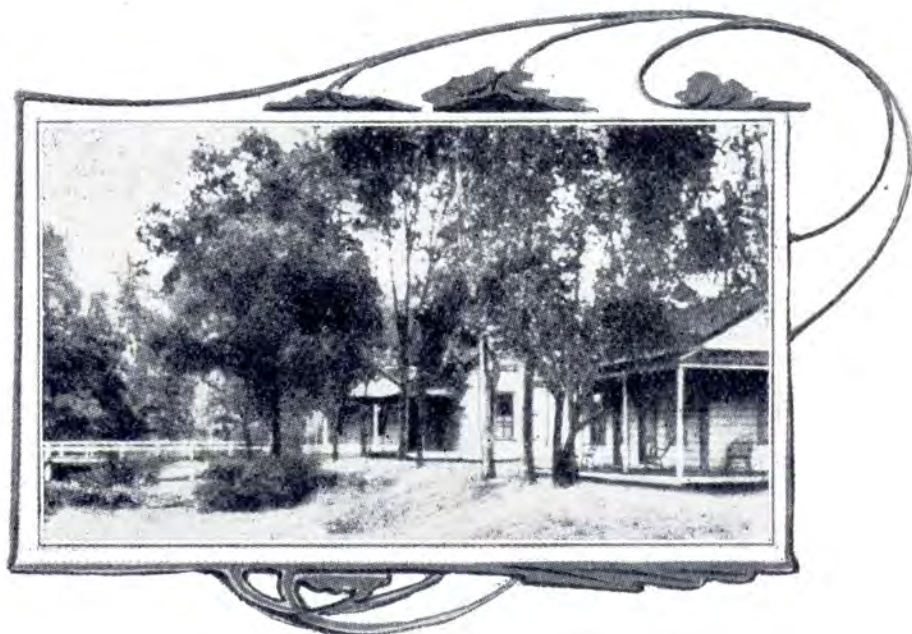

MARK WEST WARM SPRINGS.

Mark West Warm Springs—This splendid property in Sonoma County is now owned by J. F. Mulgrew (for the past thirteen years the proprietor of Skaggs Springs), and in future will be conducted under his personal management. The time required to reach the springs from San Francisco is but three and one-half hours, the last seven miles being by stage from Fulton up Mark West Creek over a most picturesque road. There are eight mineral springs all within five minutes' walk of the hotel, consisting of magnesia, sulphur, iron, arsenic and soda. The wild grape vine arbors excite the wonder and admiration of all visitors. The arbor covering the hotel veranda and driveway consists of twelve vines, probably the largest in the world (several of them measuring more than two feet in circumference), and forming an arbor 50 by 170 feet in dimensions. The warm mineral water baths are delightful and the boating and swimming in Mark West Creek, at the hotel, is superb. The accommodations have been more than doubled and now 200 guests can be cared for. The special feature of the place will be found to be the good beds and first class table. Stages connect with both morning and afternoon trains to and from San Francisco at Fulton, thence by stage 7 miles to the springs. THE GEYSERS.

The Geysers—The Hotel is now opened for the fifth year under the management of Mr. R. H. Curry, which speaks for itself. Many improvements have been made; new cottages—new floored tents and a fine pavilion for dancing. Excellent music will be in attendance during the season. The bath house has been renovated and new baths added. The hotel, cottages grounds and bath houses are electrically lighted. Good livery is run in connection with the hotel; saddle horses and donkeys for mountain climbing. Postoffice and long distance telephone. Daily stages to and from Cloverdale. Through ticket. Duncan Springs—Hopland. Beautifully located two miles from Hopland station, and four and one-half hours from San Francisco. The hotel and annexes are built on an elevation of 250 feet above the valley, and the view of the surrounding mountains and meadows from the verandas is most picturesque. A fine ten-room bungalow has just been completed to be used in connection with the hotel. The rooms are arranged en suite, and are modern in every respect. The hotel proper has undergone extensive alterations, the main features of which are:—a large sun parlor, larger dining room, larger office, etc. For those who like tramping, many long, graded and well-kept trails have been provided. The one through Howell Canyon is particularly attractive. The principal mineral waters are: magnesia, soda, iron and sulphur, the first two of which are especially well-known for their remarkable medicinal virtues. The magnesia is bottled by the Duncan Springs Mineral Water Co. of 21 Shotwell St., San Francisco. There are several housekeeping cottages which contain from two to three rooms and rent at from \$16.00 to \$18.00 per month. A new twelve-room bath house, fitted with porcelain lined tubs affords first-class bathing; soda water is used for this purpose, and can be heated to any desired temperature by steam. Baths are 25c. each or five for \$1.00. Amusements are dancing, hunting, fishing, swimming in Russian River, shuffleboard, pool, and croquet. Can accommodate 140. Two mails daily. Open May 15th. BOATING ON RUSSIAN RIVER AT HEALDSBURG.

Those who board in Healdsburg, or the vicinity, or those who camp in the country around, will have this summer the advantage of a fine stream for boating, bathing and fishing. The Russian River flows around the base of Fitch Mountain and skirts the town of Healdsburg. Last year a dam was placed in the river at the lower end of the town, affording a fine stream two miles in length, and this year the dam will be replaced. The scenery along this part of the river is not excelled anywhere.
